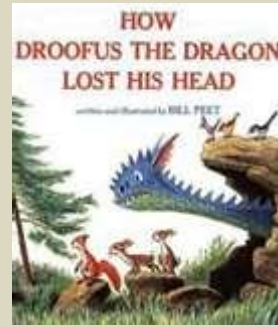
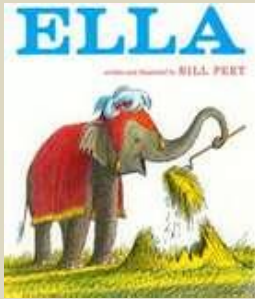

What can I do this summer?

As we get closer to summer break, I often have parents wonder what they can do to keep their children engaged in learning over the summer....here are some suggestions:

1. Totus Tuus - this is taking the place of Vacation Bible School this summer, registration begins this weekend at church.
 - Dates and times are as follows:
 - Grades 7-12: Sunday, June 17 - Thursday, June 21 from 7:30-9:45
 - Grades 1-6: Monday, June 18 - Friday, June 22 from 9:00-3:00
 - Registration fee is \$30.00 per child for the week (or \$80.00 per family) - due at registration.
 - Sack lunches **MUST** be brought for grades 1-6 each day.
 - To help provide snacks for the children and the volunteers each day, we are asking the following to be brought the first day of class:

 - Grades 6-8 cookies
